CONTEST RULES:

1: Entry must be an original artwork of student. Only one entry per student.

2: Please only use poster paper provided, it may be used vertically or horizontally. Poster may be done in crayon, marker, paint of any kind, ink, colored pencil or any combination of these. Please do NOT use glue, glitter, clip art, attachments, or computer aided entries.

3: Please use good legible lettering and lots of color!

4: The poster must be related to the contest theme RY of LIGHT CHALLENGE. The words "Be someone's Ry Of Light" and the date "APRIL 26th 2024" must be on the poster and spelled correctly.

5: Entry must be signed on the back of the poster with the students name and the entry/permission form (signed by their parent/guardian) stapled to the back of the poster on any corner.

6: Please Do Not Fold poster and return back to your teacher no later than April 19th, 2024.

7: There will be a 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place winner.
